


## Nominations for Honorary Membership!

#### Sara Witter Connor

We could write a book on all that Sara Witter Connor has done for Wisconsin's Airborne. From the Army War College to our Walt All Airborne Memorial, Sara has been there for us. (I have 8+ pages of Sara's Bio so this is a very short summary.)

Sara commissioned 4'x8' Glider Rider panels telling the story of the WWII Glider Regiments of the 101st and 82nd Airborne. The panels, which also detail Wisconsin's role in producing WACO Gliders, ships and planes are well done. The Badger Chapter has been able to use them at several of our Badger Airborne events, Air Shows and the WWII Vets dinner.

A close friend of Col. Don Patton, Director of the Twin Cities Military History Symposium, Sara was a contributor/organizer for Don's National Glider Symposium in the TC. A couple of years later we talked her into organizing the 2nd National Glider Symposium at UW-Madison. That was and outstanding event drawing 82nd and 101st Glider Riders and Pilots from across the USA. Maggie gave a stirring talk there, connecting our WWII heroes to the Airborne Lads fighting in Iraq/ Afghanistan, in the eternal Airborne Brotherhood. Sara brought in Ltc. Guy Lofaro, retired 325 and Ranger School commander and author of "The Sword of St. Michael", an expert on Gliders and the WWII All Americans.

It was the best Airborne Conference I've ever attended.

#### **Shirley Mook & Mike Freirer**

From Shirley: The third museum display that had been planned was the military since World War II veterans were disappearing rapidly. I started my adventure by reading three books on the Bataan Death March. They were personal accounts. I got my initiation into war and the atrocities that ensued. From there, I started reading books from each of the wars to get, again, the personal stories.

I had to go out and raise funds. It was during the economic downturn so businesses did not give as much as anticipated but we made do. We took a trip to the Veteran's Museum which was very helpful. Our first carpenter was one of our members and he and another member started building walls. Another professional carpenter and his crew donated time to build one of the long walls.

The ideas for the dioramas came from reading the accounts and pictures. I wanted them to be as realistic (with our limited funds) as

possible. I was able to get manikins from a clothing chain that went out of business. Some we made ourselves. The heads I got from a beauty supply and we cut hair and beards and made their faces look like they were on the battlefield.

I reached out to the American Legion. One of my donors was a Legion member and suggested that Mike could paint a jungle mural for us. He did and that began our journey. He was still working as the manager at the Legion and so started helping "bits and pieces."

Mike told me that when he retired as manager at the Legion, he would help us as much as we needed him. Three and a half years after we opened the Lest We Forget Exhibit, I felt that we had not devoted enough to World War II in Europe so we made some major changes and devoted an entire room to that. D-Day was a must and Mike started the construction of that diorama. Our Police Chief, who was a friend, did the construction for Battle of the Bulge. His father was there. **The paratroopers and glider display was added, also.** 

My attendance at the WW II glider symposium was an awesome experience. Sara told me about the event earlier and encouraged me to attend. I talked at length with Jim Megellas on one of the breaks. There were others also, including Les Schwarm. Their stories were gripping. I had previously done a lot of reading relative to the 101<sup>st</sup> and 82<sup>nd</sup>. The connection with Marshfield and the gliders had been a major factor, also.

When we were given the notice we had to move from the Thomas House, it was Mike and another council member who convinced the librarian to give us the space we have. As we probably told you the move was awful but we made it work especially going into a much smaller space. Mike was particularly valuable in that respect. We worked together at least four days a week. I express my deep appreciation for Mike and his skills. Anything I want, he does and his advice is great. We work well as a team.

A summary or Mike's bio is as follows:

Air Force veteran from Vietnam War – stationed in Thailand. 3-4 years as a journeyman printer with the Marshfield News Herald; 20 years designing monuments for Marshfield Monuments Manager of American Legion Post 54 (retired about 4 years ago).

#### **Greetings Fellow Troopers!!**

I am sitting here, in Northwestern Wisconsin watching a light snow dancing out my window, my mind drifts to how it must have been for those soldiers, our great warriors of WWII, like Floyd Pratt, Jim Megellas, Doc Stolp, and countless others, dealing with winter, on the battlefield in places like Belgium, Germany, and France. As beautiful as it may be outside, a walk in the woods, I often wonder if that joy and sense of nature was in the environment that they served, and if there ever any peaceful reflections of home, like the beautiful representation of a winter in Wisconsin. Or, in fact those who were spared the ultimate sacrifice found peace in coming home to a winter wonderland, such as the northern woods and the soft silent snow, and the sound of the wind over a barren but beautiful landscape of forests, frozen lakes and rolling hills and found it to be a form of healing.

Coming home, for me, is quite possibly a soldier's dream of perfection and centering with one's self.

We have the privilege to be in a position to answer the call for just that, to welcome a soldier home, or help them make some sense of what they have been through, to let them know that no matter what they come home to upon their return, we will be there for them. We are their link, their fraternal connection to a legacy of brotherhood that is coming up to a centennial level in August of 2017. That is right, our beloved Division turns 100 years old! On August 5, 1917, the 82d Division was constituted and by the 25th of the same month, organized in Camp Gordon, Georgia, and the rest my comrades, as they say, is history. Soldiers from all of the 48 states, formed this new Division, and

deemed us the name, "All Americans".

We had a recent death of a trooper, SGT Donald Marine, in the Mondovi, WI area. He toured multiple deployments in Iraq and Afghanistan, and as an organization, had no idea that this 33-year-old

### Strutz Honored!



In tribute to VE Day, Paratrooper Col. John Scocos with Chief Clerk Jeff Renk, USMC/82nd Vet; honored WWII 504's Gene Strutzenberg, and wife Donna, Brodhead, at Madison's Military Museum. Paratrooper Edward W. Wormhoudt, age 91 of Durand, died October 30, 2015 at Sacred Heart Hospital in Eau Claire with his family by his side. Edward was born October 5, 1924 in Iowa. He was the son of Andrew and Rachel (Weston) Wormhoudt. He graduated from high school and joined the U.S. Army and served overseas in North Africa, Italy and Austria during WWII and was Honorably Discharged. Edward then went to Lawrence Tech and attained his Engineering Degree. He married Elaine Avis Horton and they bought house in Detroit. Edward worked for and architectural firm for 12 years before taking a job at Ford Motor Company. Edward worked for Ford until retiring in 1991.
